his father, King George III, deteriorated, probably from the disease porphyria The elder George suffered bouts of insanity in 1788 as well The younger George became the Prince Regent, although the Parliament held much of the real power When his father died in 1820 at the age of 81, the prince became George IV, without any change in powers
