Temperament Dimensions (continued) Thomas and Chess's Temperament Types •Easy babies: 40% of infants; adjust easily to new situations, quickly establish routines, are generally cheerful and easy to calm •Difficult babies: 10% of infants; slow to adjust to new experiences, likely to react negatively and intensely to stimuli and events
